The program offers saving each year on their electric heating, cooling and water heating costs. We offer a special load management electric credit of \$3 a month to all customers that are a part of the "Switch Makes Cents" program.



Not only are our customers saving money, those who installed new electric heating, cooling and water heating equipment were offered rebates to help pay for their new equipment. If you are currently enrolled in our "Switch Makes Cents" program, we will be contacting you to upgrade your switch.

Manning Municipal Utilities offers an additional .0150 cents per kWh of usage in electric heating, air conditioning, air-source heat pumps, ground-source heat pumps and water heating.

There are a number of qualifications that must be met before Switch Makes Cents can be connected at your residence.

- If you wish to control a water heater and an air source heat pump or ground source heat pump, you will be responsible for control wiring between the auxiliary heat and load control switch and any relays needed for the proper installation of the load control switch. Installation costs can vary considerably from job to job, depending on your wiring and equipment. Each install will be done on a case by case basis to determine cost. Your electrician may do wiring or Manning Municipal Utilities has electricians available to do the job at your request.
- The property owner and the person residing in the home must sign an agreement form before installation of the load control switch can be completed.
- Our special rate applies only to water heaters, air conditioning and heating systems, never the entire electric bill.
